



First AAR Rally: CANBERRA (A.C.T.) 12th & 13th MARCH, 1994

The Australian Ariel Register was formed in 1991 by Lyn Meredith and 28 Australian members of the Ariel Owners Motor Cycle Club of the U.K.

Our first rally (originally scheduled for Sept. 1992) was held in Canberra on the 12th-13th of March 1994. Headquarters for the rally was the Canberra Carotel Motel.

One of the purposes of the rally was to officially form the Australian Ariel Register, appoint office bearers and hold our first annual general meeting.

As the club at this stage had no official standing or insurance cover the rally called "The Val Page Rally" was held under the auspices of the Veteran and Vintage & Classic Motorcycle Club of the A.C.T.

There were 64 entries for the rally and this included 48 Ariels and 2 "other makes".

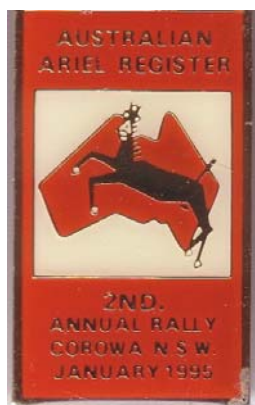

Third AAR Rally: **HAHNDORF (S.A.)**9th - 11th. APRIL, 1996

The South Australian members of the AAR submitted a proposal to hold the 3rd. Annual AGM and Rally at Hahndorf S.A. on 9th. - 11th. March 1996 and this was duly approved by the executive and committee. Hochstein's Resort, Main Rd. Hahndorf S.A. was the designated Headquarters for the rally and the AGM was held in the Heidelberg Room of this establishment. At the time of this rally the AAR had 239 members. There were 72 registrations for the rally with 64 Ariels entered. 113 People attended the Saturday night dinner. **Office Bearers elected at the AGM were: Graham Whitty (ACT)**, President. **Jim Acason (NSW)** Vice-President. **John White (VIC.)** Secretary. **Alan Boyd (NSW)** Treasurer and Magazine Editor.

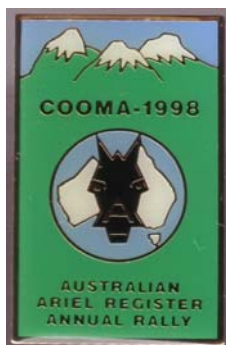
Fourth AAR Rally: **TOOWOOMBA (QLD.)12th . & 13th . APRIL, 1997**

The rally headquarter for the Toowoomba rally was at the Toowoomba Motor Village & Caravan Park. As at previous rallies this establishment provided a wide range of accommodation and facilities. Bill McKee and Kevin Wheatley were organisers of this rally. There were 72 registrations and this included 65 Ariels and 3 other makes . This rally saw the only appearance at any AAR rally of an Ariel 3 owned by "Buster Anderson". The AGM and the Rally Dinner were held at "Banjo's Restaurant , which was in walking distance of the headquarters.

At the AGM the office bearers and committee were all re-elected, with Chris Butler becoming Tasmanian Representative and Kevin Wheatley the Queensland representative. The majority attending the rally arrived on the overnight ferry from Melbourne which landed at Devonport . Most of the riders had bought their bikes via the ferry so it was then just a short ride (15Km,s) to Ulverstone. Quite a few members elected to fly to Tasmania and hire a car and forgo the pleasure (and problems) of taking their Ariels. In total 98 people attended and 39 bikes. The AGM and the Rally Dinner were held at the Ulverstone Surf Club which adjoined the camping ground where a majority of the attendees were staying in a wide range of accommodation from tents to cabins.
